

How to Make a Pledge

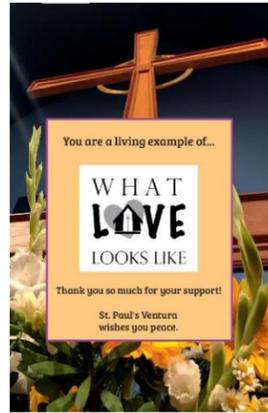
Please think and pray about this important decision, and then complete a pledge card or simply let us know how much you'd like to pledge in any way that is convenient for you – mail, call, email, etc.

1 Operating Expenses & Staff

With your help we can keep the church running, pay our monthly bills, purchase supplies, and produce bulletins, newsletters, and promotions. We can also take care of our dedicated staff.

2 Sunday Worship Services

As a liturgical church, the heart and soul of who we are is expressed in our worship services. Your pledge makes it possible for us to offer weekly worship services as we have for over 133 years.

Church Budgeting:

What does it cost to run the church for a year?

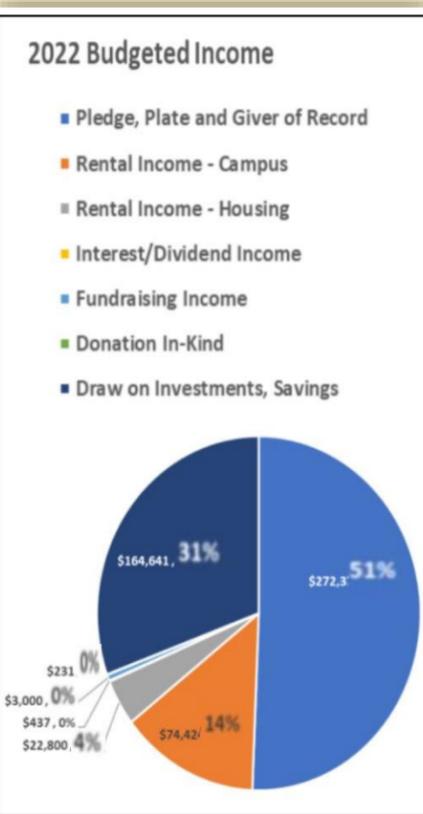
What does our pledge money cover?



The church Operating Budget varies from year to year depending on income, needs and what the Vestry chooses to focus on that year. In 2022 we adjusted our budget to reflect the needs of the church during a global pandemic. We offered Sunday services both in-person and online, and reached out to the congregation as we all worked to adjust to the new reality we found ourselves in. Unfortunately, the year was a challenging one. COVID spikes and surges continued to come and go. Through it all, the congregation was faithful. Your pledges got us through, and we are most grateful!

OPERATING INCOME – Where does the money come from?

The funds we have to work with come from pledges payments, plate donations and other gifts, but also from campus rental income, facility use fees and fundraising. We also draw from some funds from our savings, and we make a small annual draw on our investments. In 2022, most of the pledges have come in consistent with the initial pledge commitments regardless of the pandemic. Rental income has been consistent, and with the recent addition of Pulse Drumming, our rental income should exceed our budget. The renovation of the Gooden Center will make it possible for us to lease it as a residence and should provide additional rental income by late 2022. Fundraisers have started again and are helping to bring in additional income. Thank you for your support!



- **51% Pledge, Plate and Giver of Record** (a giver who doesn't have a pledge)
- **14% Rental Income – Campus:** La Famiglia Preschool, Kindermusik, and Pulse Drumming
- **4% Rental Income – Housing:** San Pablo House
- **Less than 1% Interest/Dividend Income**
- **Less than 1% Fundraising Income**
- **Less than 1% In-Kind Donations**
- **31% Draw on Investments and Savings**

EXPENSES – Where does the money go?

- **58% goes to Employee Costs** – Our staff currently includes one full-time Clergy, a part-time Parish Administrator, a part-time Sexton (groundkeeper), a part-time Music Minister, a part-time Choir Director, a part-time Organist, an ASL Interpreter, and three part-time positions in Youth & Children's Ministries.
- **14% goes to Buildings & Grounds** – cleaning services and supplies, landscaping services, property taxes, trash pickup, utilities, and security as well as upkeep and projects on campus. We have a very large campus and feel that it's important to keep up with the maintenance and not let the campus fall into disrepair. The Buildings & Grounds Committee forecasts the projects we'll need to do in the coming year and the approximate cost.
- **14% goes to Administrative Expenses** – everything it takes to keep the office running and the congregation up to date, including: telephone and internet, copier lease, office supplies, bookkeeping software and services, technical equipment and maintenance, insurance, account and program fees, and postage.
- **9% goes to Mission Outreach** – costs associated with the ways we reach out to the world in the name of Christ including: our pledge to support Mission Congregations in the Diocese, our Deanery dues, and a gift to support Theological Education. We also pledge to support operations of Family to Family and support various programs that serve our neighbors in need.
- **5% goes to Program Expenses** – this does not include the clergy or staff needed to run the programs, they are in Employee Costs. Program Expenses consists of all the supplies needed for worship services--altar supplies, flowers, hospitality, etc. It also covers music and choir supplies, organ maintenance & repair, and the curriculum, supplies, and materials for all our programs including Sunday School.
