Church Budgeting:

What does it cost to run the church for a year?
What does our pledge money cover?

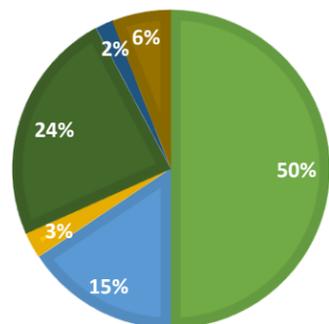
The church Operating Budget varies from year to year depending on income, needs and what the Vestry chooses to focus on that year. In 2020 we changed our budget to include some of the employees brought in during the Comprehensive Growth Project so they could continue their wonderful work. Here's a quick look at the 2020 Budget. What will happen in 2021? That depends on how much income we can expect and what happens with the pandemic.

OPERATING INCOME – Where does the money come from?

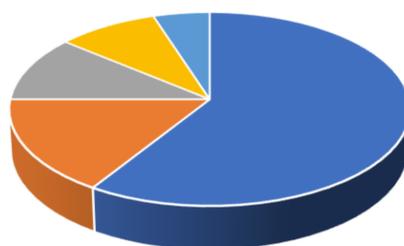
The funds we have to work with come from pledges payments, plate donations and other gifts but also from campus rental income, facility use fees and fundraising. We also draw from some funds (savings) and continue to use up some money that remained after the Comprehensive Growth Project concluded. In 2020 most of the pledges continued to come in despite the pandemic. Unfortunately, some of our renters have been unable to keep up with their rent, fundraisers had to be postponed and several potential new renters did not move in. Things are "on hold" as we wait for schools to be able to reopen after the danger passes.

EXPENSES – Where does the money go?

1. **59% goes to Employee Costs** – Our staff includes two full-time Clergy, a part-time Parish Administrator, a part-time Sexton (groundkeeper), a part-time Music Minister, a part-time Assistant Music Minister, a part-time Organist, an ASL Interpreter, and an hourly Nursery Care Provider.
2. **16% goes to Buildings & Grounds** – This category includes: cleaning services and supplies, landscaping services, property taxes, trash pick up, utilities, and security as well as upkeep and projects on campus. We have a very large campus and feel that it's important to keep up with the maintenance and not let the campus fall into disrepair. The Building and Grounds Committee forecasts the projects we'll need to do in the coming year and the approximate cost.
3. **11% goes to Administrative Expenses** – This category includes everything it takes to keep the office running and the congregation up-to-date, including: telephone and internet, copier lease and office supplies, bookkeeping software and services, technical equipment and maintenance, insurance, account and program fees, and postage.
4. **9% goes to Mission Outreach** – These are the costs associated with the ways we reach out to the world in the name of Christ. They include: our pledge to support Mission Congregations in the Diocese of Los Angeles, a small amount for Deanery dues and a gift to support Theological Education. We also pledge to support operations of Family to Family (this does not include the food needed for our turn each month to help feed the hungry), and support various programs that serve the needy locally and throughout the world.
5. **5% goes to Program Expenses** – this does not include the clergy or staff needed to run the programs. They are in Employee Costs. Program Expenses consists of all the supplies needed for worship services--altar supplies, flowers, hospitality, etc. It also covers music and choir supplies, organ maintenance & repair, and the curriculum, supplies, and materials for all our programs including Sunday School and Youth Group.
